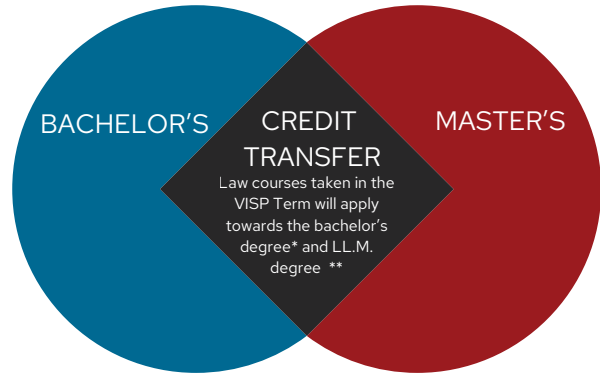


VISP Term + LL.M. Program

The VISP Term +LL.M. Program provides an opportunity for qualified undergraduate students to attend courses at UW–Madison as non-degree Visiting International Student Program (VISP) students for one semester of study. These students, upon successful completion of their baccalaureate degree from their home institution, will be eligible to apply for admission to the University of Wisconsin Law School LL.M. program.



*The home institution will determine which course credits earned by the student registered at UW–Madison will be transferable to the home institution and used toward the completion of the home institution's baccalaureate degree.
** Up to 11 credits will transfer to the LL.M. Program.

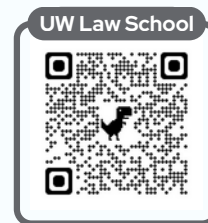
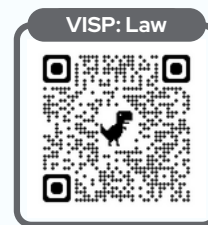

Fall 2026 Admission Process and Program timeline

- 01** Check with your home university coordinator on the nomination process and submit your application to them.
- 02** UW Law School receives student nomination from your home university by the mid-April 2026
- 03** The VISP office will contact you to submit their online VISP application.
- 04** UW Law School will work with the VISP office to review completed applications. You will be notified of a decision within two weeks.
- 05** Program orientation begins mid-August, class starts in September 2026.
